

vivaAerobus submits all the formal applications with the US and Mexican authorities

vivaAerobus CEO Mike Szucs commented “We have had huge support from the Mexican and US authorities for the commencement of our services between Austin and Mexico and the process for approval with the FAA and DfT is now formally underway. The market feedback has also been incredibly positive and fully endorses our view that the people of Mexico and the United States are looking forward to some genuine low fare air services between the two countries. Our initial filing is for six routes from Austin to Cancun, Guadalajara, Leon, Monterrey, Puebla and Queretaro. The choice of these routes emphasises the ability of the vivaAerobus proposition to appeal to all aspects of the air travel market, whether it be leisure travel, business travel or visiting friends and relatives. These new services present a fantastic opportunity for people that would previously have been put off travelling by ridiculously high air fares and is line with our mission to make air travel available to all people and all communities.”

Szucs went on further to explain “these new services are the culmination of a huge amount of work from many people at vivaAerobus and the partners that we have chosen to work with. Our partners at Austin-Bergstrom have been fully behind this project from day one; their commitment to work with vivaAerobus to help deliver genuine low fare services was instrumental in the selection of Austin-Bergstrom as the launch airport for our Mexico-US operations. We look forward to working with Austin-Bergstrom to introduce these new services plus many more in the years ahead.”
